


Dear parents and carers,


Autumn has been brilliant!! We have enjoyed carving pumpkins, collecting leaves, sticks and conkers using all of our senses to explore and discover.




Through this topic we will be talking about light and dark. The children have a dark den in their classroom. We also watched some fireworks on 5<sup>th</sup> November.
